St Anne's provides a wide range of housing, day care and community support to people with a wide variety of needs. This includes people with a learning disability, a mental health or substance use problem and the many homeless people who still need our services.

Choice and Opportunity

People who use our services are as involved where possible in the development of their own care plans, and are supported in making informed choices about all aspects of their lives using a person centred approach.

Clients are encouraged to be as involved in running the organisation as they want to be.

For example, St Anne's Board (the organisation's governing body) has a strong Client membership and Clients are involved in a variety of ways in the recruitment of all staff who will support them. There are a number of Client forums and Clients also help to give feedback in surveys and as part of our internal inspections and visits.

We are constantly looking at ways Clients can be more involved - if this is what they want.

St Anne's avoids a 'one size fits all' approach but rather treats everyone as the individual they are.

St. Anne's currently has services for people with learning disabilities in Leeds, North Yorkshire, Calderdale, Kirklees, York, East Yorkshire, Middlesbrough, County Durham, South and North Tyneside, Sunderland and Newcastle.
